Padre's Piece Holy Communion

In the Latin rite of the Church, Catholics can receive Communion two ways – directly on the tongue or in the hand. As the person comes forward to receive Holy Communion, they make a reverent bow, as one would bow before a king. We do this because we are about to encounter the King of kings!

The priest, deacon or Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion gives the communicant the host and simply says, "The Body of Christ." The communicant responds with, "Amen." If taken in the hand, the communicant should consume the host immediately.

Many parishes offer Communion under what is called both species – the bread and the wine. If that is the case, the communicant will be offered the Blood of Christ, sip from the cup and return it to the minister, who then wipes the rim of the cup immediately.

There may be times when Communion is offered under only one species. This sometimes happens when there is a flu outbreak or some other communicable disease. This is at the discretion of the priest or bishop. When this happens, no one should feel short-changed. You see, Jesus Christ is present – Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity – in even the smallest particle of the bread or the wine, and all the graces of the sacrament are there, too.

The relocation of the Seminary to a newly developed campus is a source of hope, as the mission to form priests who will be servant leaders after the Heart of Jesus Christ will continue in a modern facility that meets the needs of 21st century priestly formation.

Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson Isaiah 45: 1, 4-6; 1 Thessalonians 1: 1-5b; Matthew 22: 15-21

Fans of certain TV series will tell you how distracted and annoyed they become when little "teaser" messages suddenly appear in the lower right-hand corner of the screen. They distract from the main action on screen. One of modern life's small vexations.

Two thousand years ago, when that "scholar of the law" Pharisee, whom we might consider a "PhD" on the subject, approached Jesus with his question, he was coming from a background of teachers who had concocted 613 laws that covered almost any aspect of Jewish life. The main tenet of Moses' law had gotten lost. This unnamed man wanted Jesus' take on the matter. We see here that he received an answer from Our Lord in short order.

That Pharisee's motives here were mixed at best. He knew that Jesus had "silenced" the Sadducees, his perpetual adversaries. Anything to build up the Pharisee camp by tearing down their opponents! But he didn't realize that in Jesus he was up against a person who saw beneath the surface of anyone's motives or conduct. I believe that there was a bit of a scold in the blunt reply Jesus made. No friendly introduction or follow-up praise.

Of course, the whole scene has implications for us and our thinking about religion and the things of God. Do we know what the main two-sided command of God is? I believe we almost automatically observe that first part about loving God with all our heart, soul and mind. This even though we sometimes choose other things as our "gods"? Things like power, wealth and fame? But at least most of us try to have the right priorities.

But it's that second commandment, the one Our Lord says is "like" the first, that of loving our neighbor as ourselves, which gets most of us in the jungle of guilt. No matter how hard we try, the daily presence of shall I say "pesky or annoying" people often make us fall into rash judgment. That's when we must remember what Jesus said about every other law depends on the first two.

One day a certain old rich man of a miserable disposition visited a rabbi, who took the rich man by the hand and led him to a window. "Look out there," he said. The rich man looked into the street. "What do you see?" asked the rabbi. "I see men, women, and children." answered the rich man. Again, the rabbi took him by the hand and this time led him to a mirror. "Now what do you see?" "Now I see myself," the rich man replied.

Then the rabbi said, "Behold, in the window there is glass, and in the mirror, there is glass. But the glass of the mirror is covered with a little silver, and no sooner is the silver added than you cease to see others, but you see only yourself." God love you and give you His peace.




